#### 4. Approval of Minutes:

G. Brandt motioned; S. Davidson supported to approve the March 3, 2022 meeting minutes as presented. All yeas, motion was adopted on a roll call vote.

#### 6. Superintendent Report:

Maintenance Supervisor; C. Overly presented an update of the numerous WTP projects:

- The raw water redundant loop has been installed. Excellent craftsmanship done by the Contractors. They performed critical work with no mistakes or missed deadlines.
- Process controls improvements have been made; system redundancy has improved.
- East fence line has been cleared of threatening trees.
- Updates were done in the residual room during the plant shutdown. These lines and pumps are continuously in service and were in need of maintenance.
- 17 dehumidifiers have been installed throughout the plant and are functioning well.
- Updating secondary containment, improving chemical containment integrity and containment repairs.

#### **Director Report:**

Director; B. Bohlen informed the committee that the Department of Homeland Security has been onsite all week testing the cybersecurity vulnerability of the WTP. A debriefing will take place when completed.

Unmetered fire lines have been discovered in the Bay Area Water System. Each community containing these lines will be notified to verify meter installation to collect revenue.

DWS contract negotiations have concluded. The positive changes negotiated are intended to recruit future employees with credentials in the water/sewer field. The contract is currently in possession of the Union and will be presented to the BCRC for approval on April 27, 2022.

Water Quality improvements continue to develop in the Bay Area Water System. 3,000 additional feet of water main is being installed in Merritt Township to connect to Hampton Township. 1.000 additional feet of water main is being installed in Beaver Township. These additions will improve the water quality in the north and east districts. The Nine Mile Rd. booster pump station currently does not have a site to be placed.

G. Augustyniak questioned the complexity of the DHS internal cybersecurity testing.

#### 7. Other Matters:

Director; B. Bohlen received a letter from Frankenlust Township requesting a complete connection to the Bay Area Water System. Chairman; R. Campbell recused himself from the table. A complete connection of Frankenlust Township has been tested on the hydraulic module; the Bay Area Water System could handle the addition. Frankenlust Township is partially connected to the City of Saginaw water. B. Bohlen reviewed details of the City of Saginaw water contract presented to Frankenlust Township. Approval will be necessary from the TAC, BCRC and the Saginaw-Midland Municipal Water Supply Corporation. A lengthy conversation followed.

- J. Lillo motioned; S. Davidson supported to approve Frankenlust Township to pursue a complete connection to the Bay County DWS. All yeas, motioned was adopted on a roll call vote.
- J. Lillo thanked the committee for all of the letters of support received to apply for Federal and State funding for the State Park Drive project. There has been correspondence from Washington D.C. Highway Transportation funds are available and will be applied for.
